

1. Set up a productive work environment.

6. Develop hypothesis and test with an experiment.

Make a prediction based on research and test its validity with experiments.

7. Analyse results and look for patterns within research findings.

Examine information and draw conclusions about what has been found.

8. Share these findings with research community and get feedback.

Report the results and discuss what your conclusion means to your readers.

9. Archive research into an organised system.

Assemble and catalog collected data
onto an online platform.
